Friedrich Mohr, MD, a distinguished surgeon from Leipzig Germany, will be the President's Invited Lecturer at the STSA 56th Annual Meeting. Dr. Mohr began his training at the University of Bonn in 1978 and obtained his PhD in Cardiovascular Surgery in 1988. He became

co-director of Cardiovascular Surgery in 1989 and Associate Professor in Cardiovascular Surgery, Georg August University Göttingen, in 1990. In 1994 he was appointed as Professor and Chairman of Cardiac Surgery, University Leipzig and is currently also the Medical Director of the Heart Center. He is a member of multiple international societies and serves on Editorial Boards of several prestigious medical journals. Dr. Mohr will deliver the President's Invited Lecture on Friday morning, November 6 at 10:30a.m.

Bylaws Revision to be presented at STSA Annual Business Meeting in Marco Island on Friday, November 6.

The Annual Business Meeting will be held from 5:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. at the Marco Island Marriott Beach Resort, Islands A-D, in Marco Island, FL. Members will hear reports and updates from Committee Chairs. Included in the reports will be the Nominating Committee's presentation of a slate of candidates to fill upcoming 2009-2010 leadership positions. Additionally, the Membership Committee will present for election a list of candidates to become new members of STSA. Members attending their first Annual Meeting will also be recognized and presented with a membership certificate. Please note that the Annual Business Meeting is open to STSA members only.

Additionally, two important revisions to STSA Bylaws will be voted on at the Annual Business Meeting this year. The STSA Council recently approved, for consideration of the membership, new language that would allow applicants who have completed a thoracic or cardiovascular research or clinical fellowship in an STSA state or region for at least twelve consecutive months to be eligible for membership.

A second proposed revision would allow the Membership Committee and Council to recommend acceptance of individuals who, despite not meeting membership criteria regarding training, practice, or research in the STSA region, have demonstrated significant involvement with the organization through their participation in the annual meeting, contributions to the scientific program, and service to the organization. After receiving approval by the Membership Committee and the Council, active membership would be contingent upon election by the membership at an annual meeting. These revisions would open membership to a small number of individuals who had formerly not been eligible.
